### School Plan

Our school plan is up and running and is a daily part of teaching and learning across the school. In literacy every class in the school are doing daily oral language lessons using the rainbow Oral Language programme and 3rd and 4th are using a specific handwriting programme. In Numeracy the children are using a new resource for problem solving called Izak9 and are also using numeracy boards daily within lessons to share different strategies. As part of our school action plan 2023-26, we have a new Attendance Strategy up and running. Children have been 'striving for five' each week and we discuss & reward good attendance at class level and at assembly. So far this year our whole school attendance is 88.4% which is an increase from last year when it was 86%. Well done everyone !

To help keep families informed: text messages are automatically sent at 5 and 10 days absent; letters are sent out at 15 and 20 days. Please ensure a reason is provided for all absences e.g. a message on Class Dojo, send in a note or phone the school. Remember: Every School Day Counts! 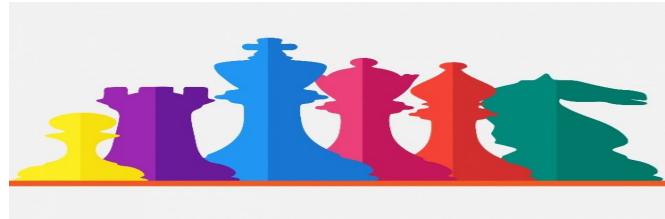
### Sambanarden and Carol Singing

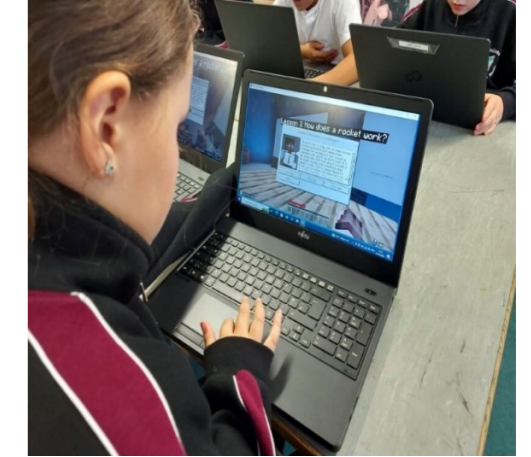
#### Exciting Prospects for 6th Class in the Creative Schools Pipeline

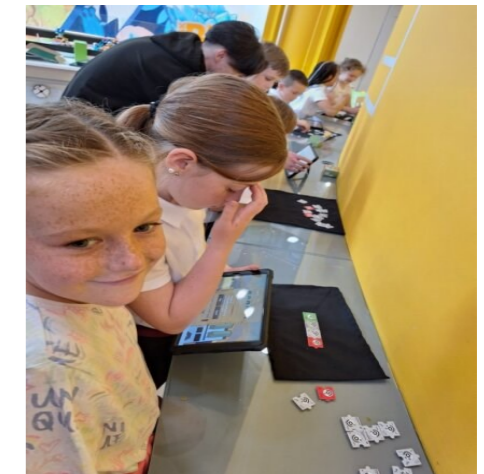


### STEM Update
